<p>CAFOD St Helen's <i>pray-fast-give</i> As we move into the New Year we anticipate the end of winter and the start of spring. In the northern and southern latitudes our seasons are clearly defined and there are times to plant and times to reap our crops. Given global trade, we enjoy the availability of many foods we once thought of as seasonal. In the tropics seasons are generally differentiated by the time when it rains and the time when it doesn't. In areas which are marginal these rains are vital. They have been somewhat unpredictable over the centuries, famine often being the outcome. I can recall such famines in India and China when millions died. In recent years, affected by changing climate, these rains can be inadequate for years. CAFOD and other agencies, but particularly government aid, is focussed on sustaining communities under such conditions. Emergency aid is essential, of course, but it would be truly wonderful if the efforts to provide drought resistant varieties and water retention structures could eliminate that need. Your donations help CAFOD to work towards such goals.
